India ranked 88th on the #Global Innovation Index (GII); last year, we ranked 57th and this year, we have graduated to occupy the 52nd spot. This progress is creditable and given prime minister Modi's vision, it won't be long before India gets into the top 50. The larger aim, of course, is to enter the top 10. We need to create innovation hubs in Schools, Colleges, Private Institutions and Government Departments and change our mindset if we want to improve our standing in the Global Innovation Index.
