
To summarize, this initiative was rather a robust step in integrating the future generations of our nation to assist in a healthy nation building process.

The Student Council of "Vidyalankar Institute of Technology" organized the "Diwali Pahat" on 4th November 2021. The event was streamed live on YouTube. Its main objective was to encourage students to come together to celebrate the Diwali festival in a traditional manner.



In addition to our wonderful anchor Pallavi Borse, who introduced the event at 9 am & also narrated the history of the most auspicious festival, Diwali; Snehil Dandawate, the winner of Mood-Indigo at IIT, initiated the event with melodious and soothing singing. "Onkar Swaroopa" which is a diverse and harmonious song he performed for the event, to create a pleasant atmosphere.







After one of our upcoming students who is adept at classical Signing, Ketaki Kelaskar sang the famous Ganesh Bhajan 'Panchatund Nararundmaladhar' that filled the viewer's heart with bliss. Following that, the host gave a quick description of the first day of Diwali, also known as Vasubaras. It is a day dedicated to worshipping cows, as they are sacred and an incarnation of God. The event reached another level of excitement with the performance of Associating Prof. Shweta Apate of Vidyalankar Institute of Technology of International Program and Higher Studies' Marathi song 'Chandane Shimpit Jashi'.





Our student Sakshi Indulkar then demonstrated a beautiful and aesthetically pleasing Rangoli. The host then goes on to explain the significance of Dhanteras, the second day of Diwali, on which Lord Dhanavantari is worshipped for imparting the knowledge of Ayurveda to mankind.



Vidyalankar Institute of Technology organized an event "Shivswarajya Din" on 6th June 2022, that marks 348 years to the coronation ceremony of the great Maratha king Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj.

This event was an attempt to pay a tribute to Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj who was not only a king to a kingdom but also treated his subjects as his own family members, served as a beacon of inspiration to thousands of individuals and is often credited for shaping the lives of many.



The event commenced at 11:00 am with the recital of a verse by the host Pallavi Borse, that was in praise of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj for his contribution towards the very existence of Maratha dynasty and the way he should be revered and respected by all of us.





The audiences experienced a real picture of the actual coronation ceremony as manifested by the host in the event.



The first speaker for the event was Mr. Ajay Jadhav. He is a successful businessman in Satara, who has an immense amount of knowledge about the events that took place during the reign of Shivaji Maharaj because of his constant research on the topic. He has greatly contributed in reconstruction of the 'Samadhi' of Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj in Sangam Mahuli near Satara district.

He enlightened us about the contribution given by the whole Bhosale family including Chhatrapati Sambhaji Maharaj, Maharani Tara Rani, and the sacrifices they made for preserving the Swarajya that was originally founded by Shivaji Maharaj. Along with Bhosale family, the clans of Jadhav, Phaltan based Nimbalkars and Verul based Bhosales contributed to the formation of base for Maharaj's Swarajya. History behind the Raj mudra that was created at the time of coronation ceremony was also highlighted by Ajay sir. He concluded by narrating how Shivaji Maharaj was a man sent by the god for protection of people and how he was supported by the great Veermata Jijabai .









Our next guest speaker was Mr. Sandeep More. He is an alumnus having being a graduate and post graduate form Vidyalankar Institute of Technology and is currently working as a Senior Consultant in the field of Cyber Security. He enlightened us about the knowledge that he gained from "Shivcharitra" that stated the journey of the great king right from his birth and his childhood where he was highly motivated and supported by his mother Veermata Jijau.

As he started working towards the formation of Swarajya, his father Mawabali Shahaji Raje was still working with Adilshahi, thereby keeping himself isolated from the work that was done by Shivaji Maharaj, so as to protect himself. This was amazingly explained by Sandeep sir. He also explained about the intelligence and guerilla warfare tactics that were used at the incident that took place between Shivaji Maharaj and Afzalkhan. He concluded by saying that the active period of Shivaji Maharaj during his reign was exceptional.









The event was concluded by our host Pallavi, by thanking the audience and the organizing members.


"Without a song, life is a sad tune"

All these programs are organized by thousands of volunteers — mostly students, teachers, professionals, young and old. 


