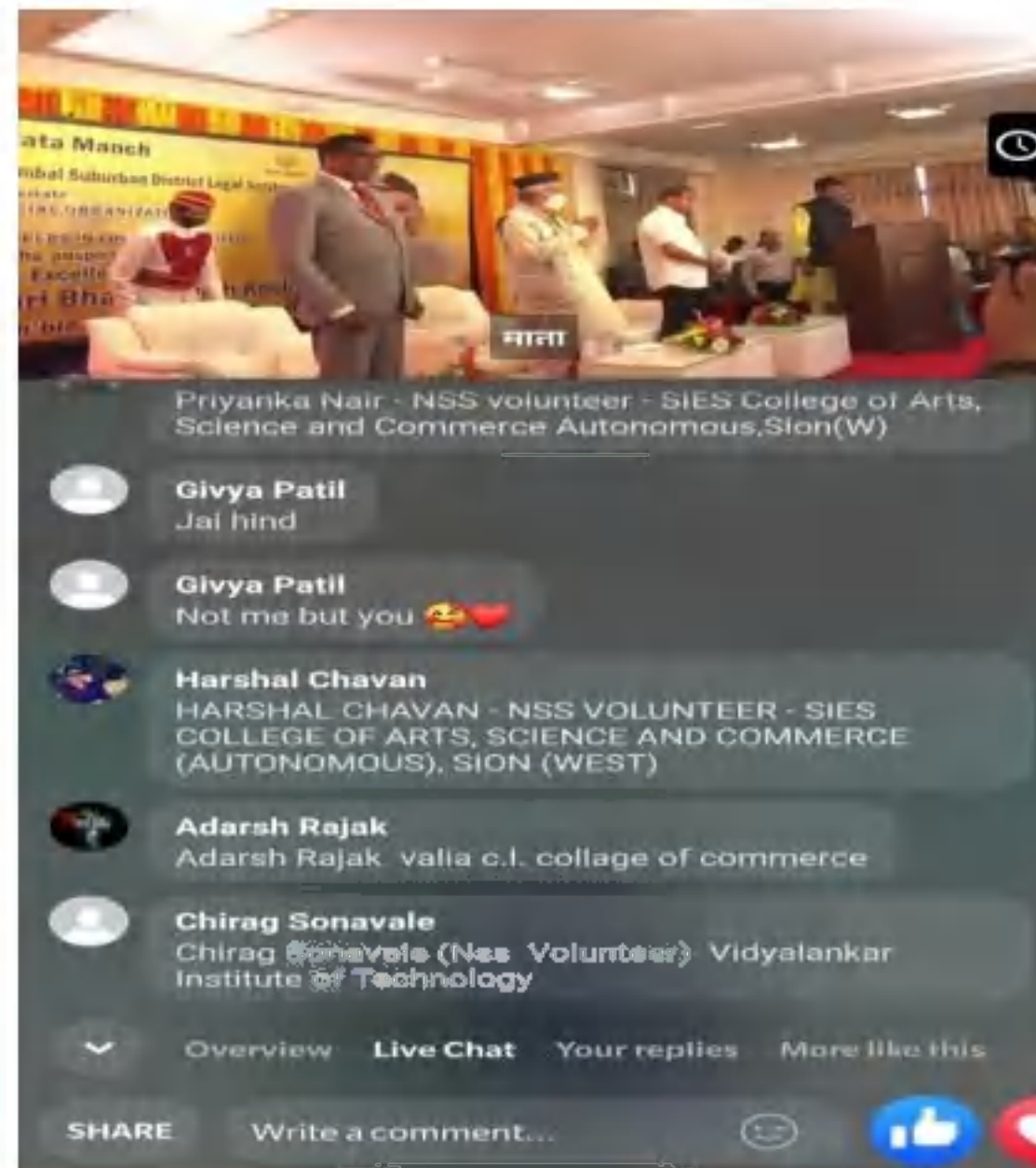

<p>The event began by lighting the lamp and a short but brief introduction of our two speakers Mr. Shailesh Parulekar and Mrs. Sonaali Borkar for the day. Initially our speaker for the day Mr. Shailesh Parulekar who is a celebrity trainer told his schedule for the day, and mentioned that he don't like people addressing him as a celebrity trainer. He says that a trainer is just a trainer there's nothing like celebrity trainer. A trainer treats all his clients equally whether he trains a celebrity or a common person. So why to address with a different name. Then he motivated the audience too to follow some kind of exercise schedule. He also mentioned how we can spare time for exercise through our college schedule. He highlighted the fact that exercising for atleast one hour daily can keep you healthy for years. He told his journey, that he started training individuals from the age of just 19. And today too he's so fit, that he challenged the audience he can do more squats that anyone else from the audience.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">He also cleared many misconceptions about health and nutrition. As many people have confusion about how much water should be drank in a day, at what time intervals etc. So he cleared that you should drink water a little before you feel thirsty, don't wait to get thirsty. Also whenever we feel hungry we should have food and not drink water because that reduces the hunger light and can affect your health. He also mentioned that we should drink water half hour prior our lunch and 45 mins after lunch as if we drink water immediately after lunch then the food will float in our stomach resulting in indigestion. He also shared his many experiences while training individuals may it be any celebrity or common person and as he had went worldwide for training his clients. So he had a lot of experiences to share and alerted the audience that they shouldn't make those mistakes in their life. He also told the real way of performing a squat, as these days the meaning of a squat</p>	

has changed. He said that youngsters nowadays do a chair squat which is not at all useful for our body, if we perform a deep squat then and then it will be fruitful. There are a lots of squats to perform but these youngsters find it difficult to perform just a chair squat, due to lack of stamina and patience for doing it. So he mentioned that to increase your stamina you must do cycling atleast 15mins daily.

Later there was a Q n A Session, where the audience took valuable tips to stay fit and follow the nutrition cycle. Many students asked questions that if they want to start their own fitness club, then what steps should be followed to be as successful as the Mr. Shailesh. The speaker also appreciated the enthusiasm of the audience and their long terms dreams. So, the event was a success and insightful as well.

All the major events, from Vasco da Gama's arrival in the country in 1498 to Mahatma Gandhi's assassination in 1948 will be discussed in the drama," . "By being a part of the drama, we came to know a lot about the freedom struggle and we aim to spread the knowledge to other children too. Polio drive was a good experience, during the polio campaign, around 178 children less than 5 years of age are given the polio drops through a polio booth. Though India is certified as a "polio free" The risk of the deadly viral polio disease that was once the leading cause of paralysis among children worldwide, is very close to being eradicated. Since 1988, the number of children affected by polio has reduced by 99 per cent. To eliminate polio completely, every child in every household must be vaccinated. But thousands of children are still missing out on the polio vaccine. Volunteers vaccinated around 178 children this polio immunization program was held successful as due to the COVID-19 pandemic, many of these children live in remote, fragile, and conflict-affected areas, which makes reaching them with vaccines even more difficult. Massive migrant and refugee populations, discrepancies in quality of vaccination campaigns and misinformation about vaccines also hamper polio eradication efforts. Volunteers learned about Inactive Polio Vaccine (IPV) and Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV) and their detailed information, volunteers vaccinated as well as educated each parent they attended.</p>

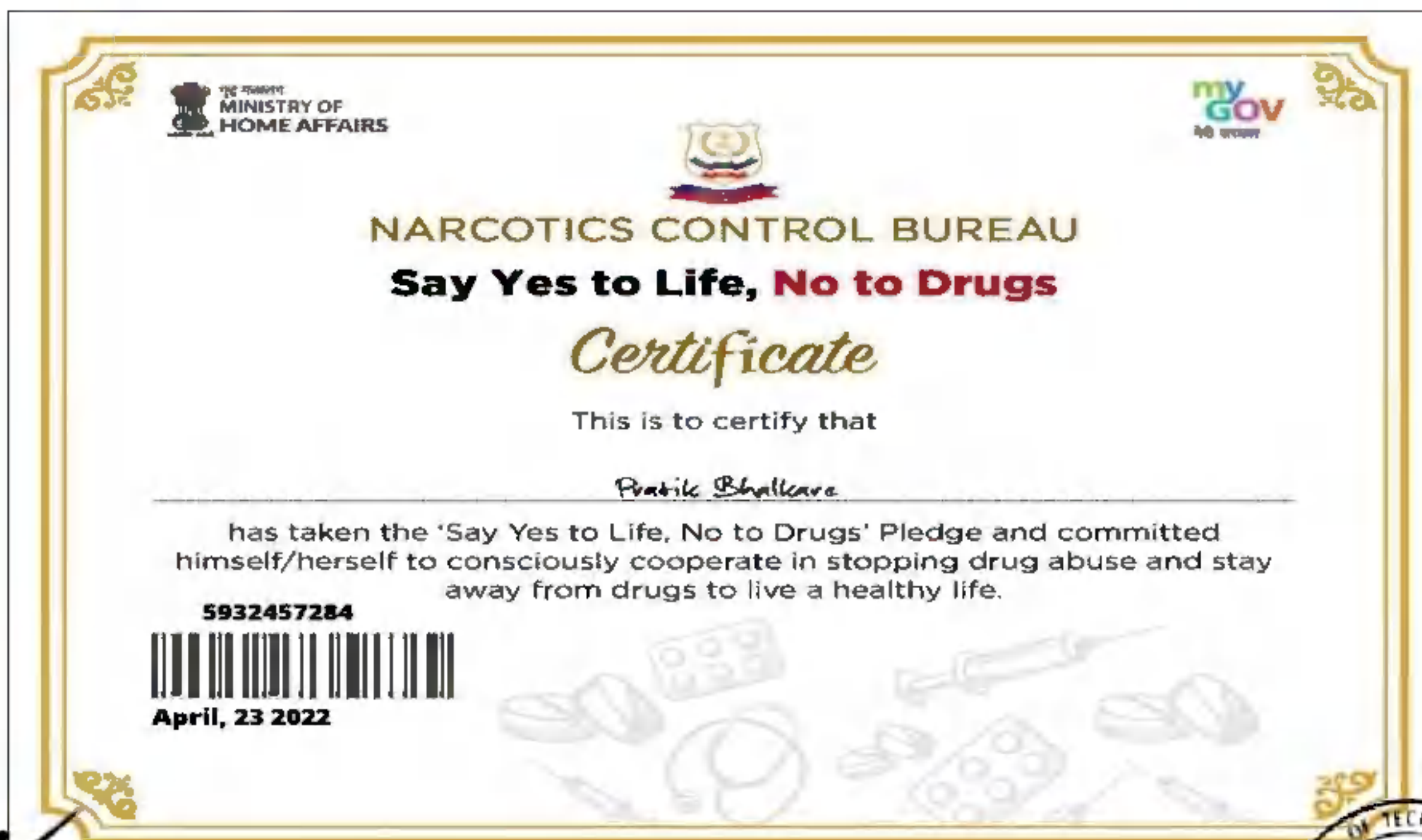

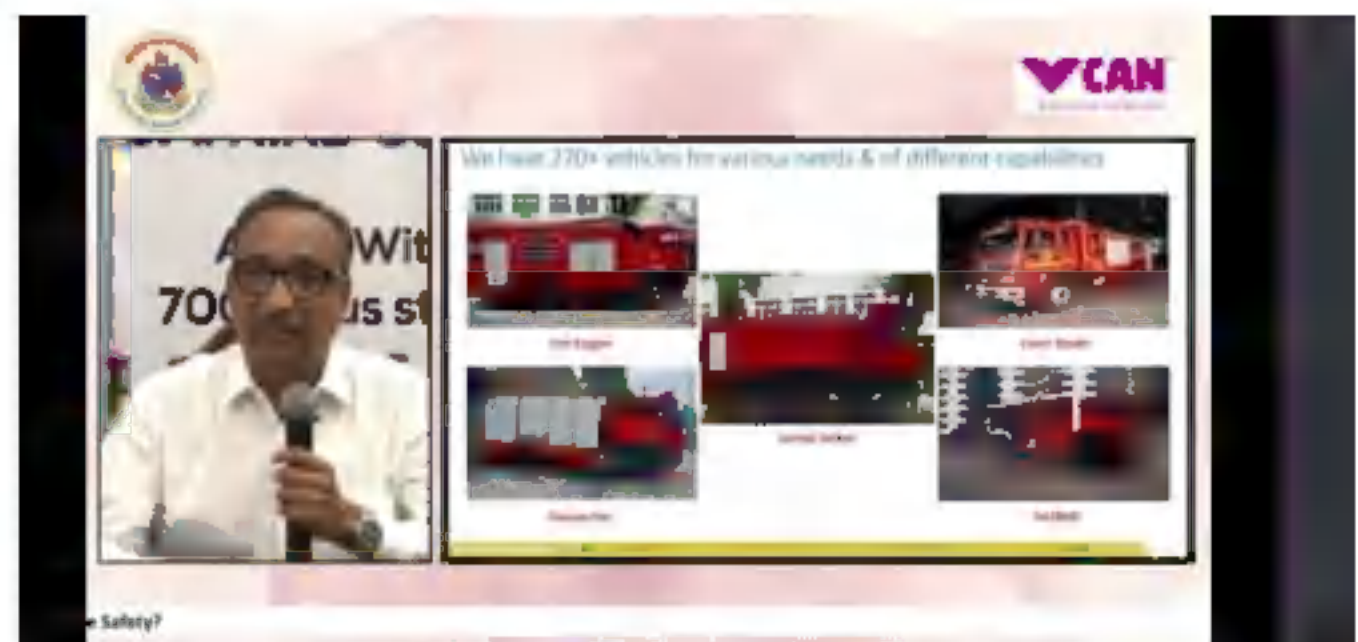
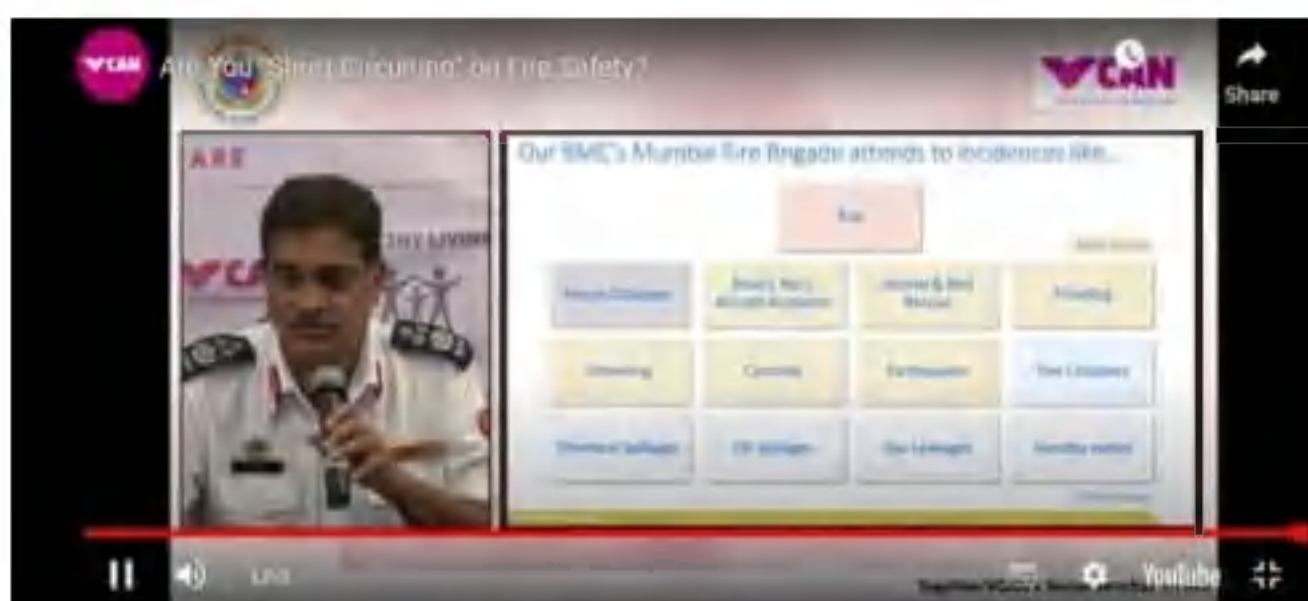

<p>VCAN(V Citizen Action Network) in collaboration with NSS UNIT OF JAI HIND COLLEGE iaunched a new series with their 1st session on “Early Intervention, Ensuring Good Beginnings”.</p> <p>The event started with the introductory speech by the host with the guest speakers ENT Surgeon- Dr. Milind Kirtane and Sbri Cbandrasbekhar Cbore, Jt. Municipal Commissioner to Municipal Commissioner BMC.</p> <p>Firstly, Dr. Milind Kirtane shared his views on what probiems do children face and what are the remedies available as a treatment. He introduced us with Cocblear Implant “An Electronic Marvel”. The device basically works as an amplifier, it helps the patient’s brain to get the bigger stimulus, which makes the patient to hear the sound. Elaborating his views, he also shared the best age for implantation for child is first three years of age, as the capacity of the chiid’s brain to learn a language is high.</p> <p>Further, Shri Chandrashekar Chore added that in our country, 1 in 250 newborns tend to have hearing issues, thus BMC has made it compulsory to take an initiative of doing a hearing test for every newborn. And if the issue is detected, before they turn 3 years oid, most of them can be treated with some aid.</p> <p>Lastly, taking questions of viewers, speakers answered every question asked by the viewer, they also suggested the solutions which should be adopted by today’s generation to prevent the causes of hearing impairment.</p>	

Conclusion

The seminar was successfully conducted by the NSS Unit of JAI HIND College. The initiative taken by the BMC is up to mark, if we are able to find the hearing impairment in children at early age, we have more chances to bring their hearing power back. We also understood how to talk interact or communicate with special children, we should speak clearly, in a natural tone and should not make exaggerated movements. 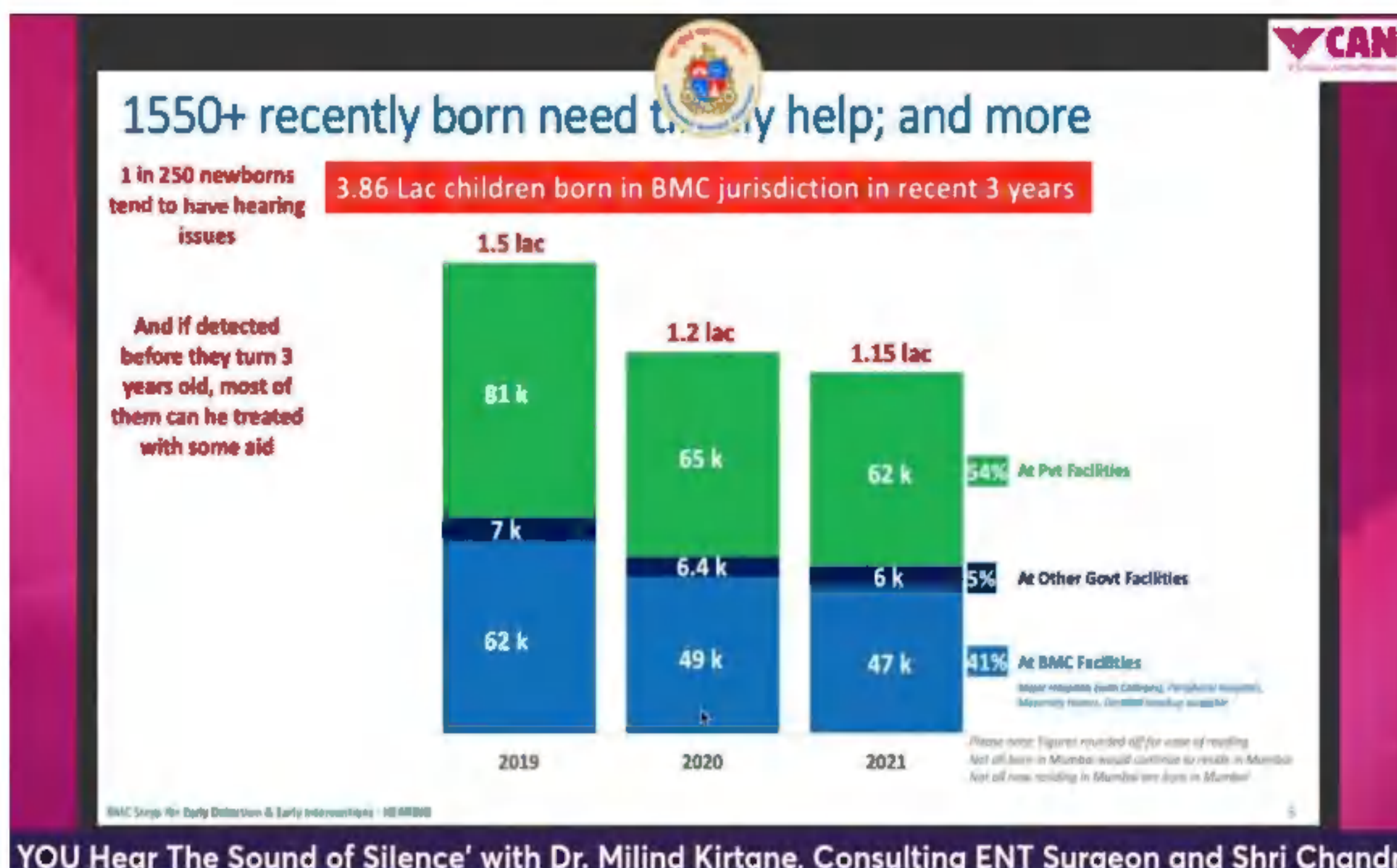
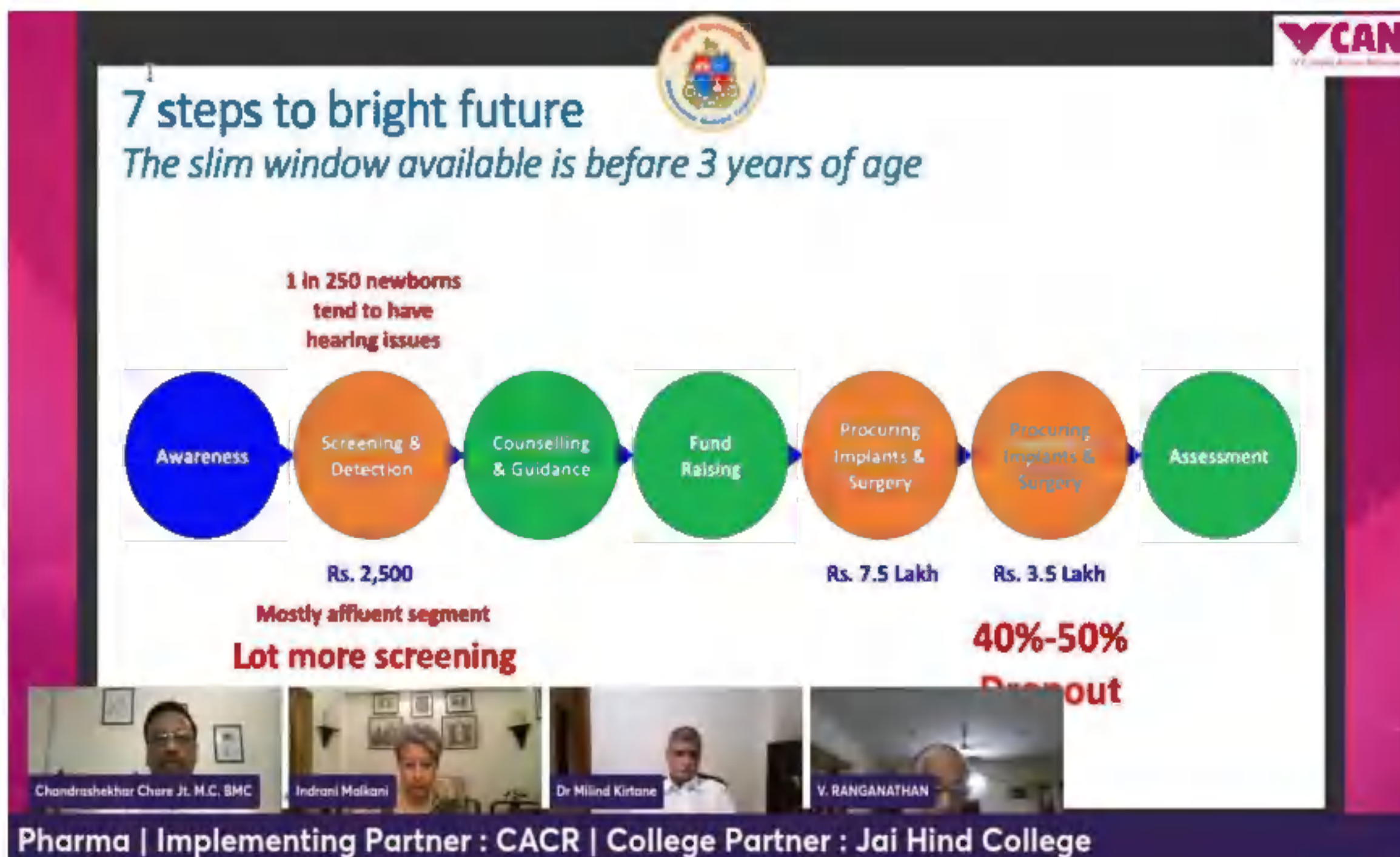
