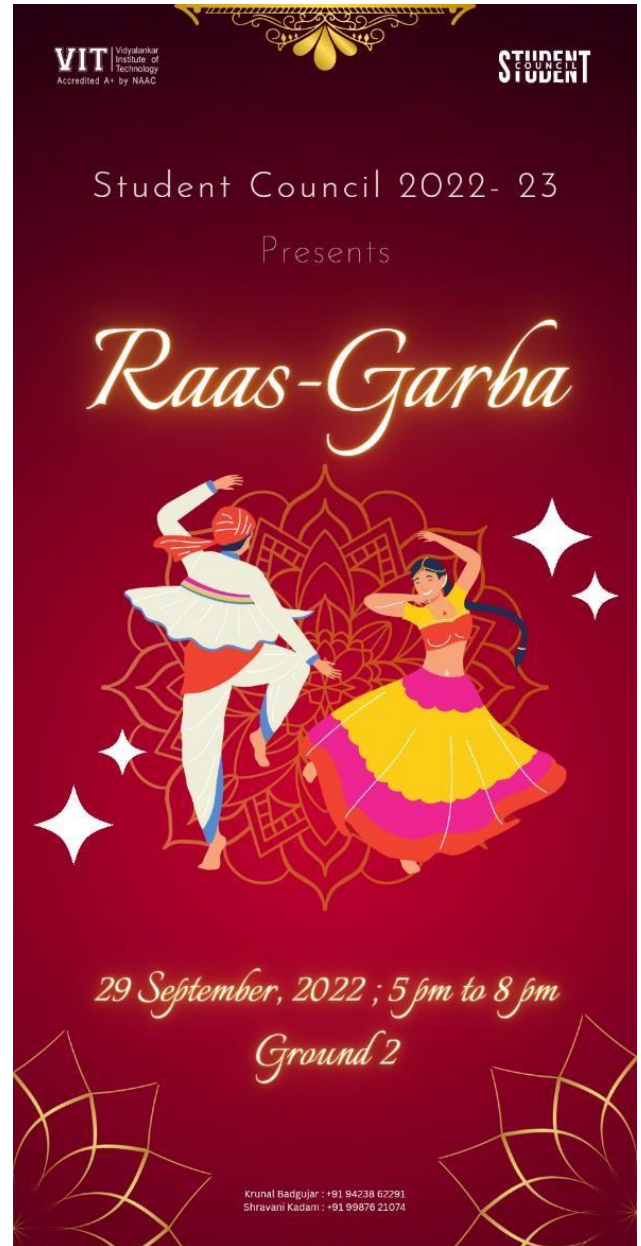
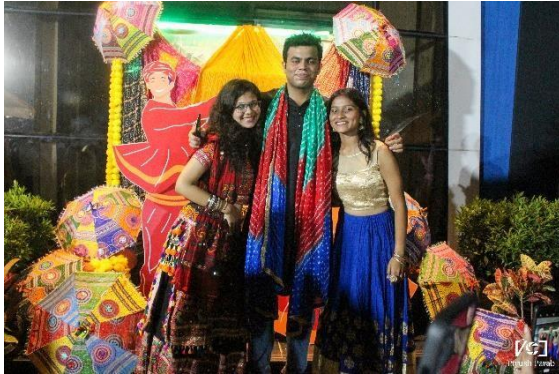
"It is with your feet that you move... but it is with your heart that you dance."

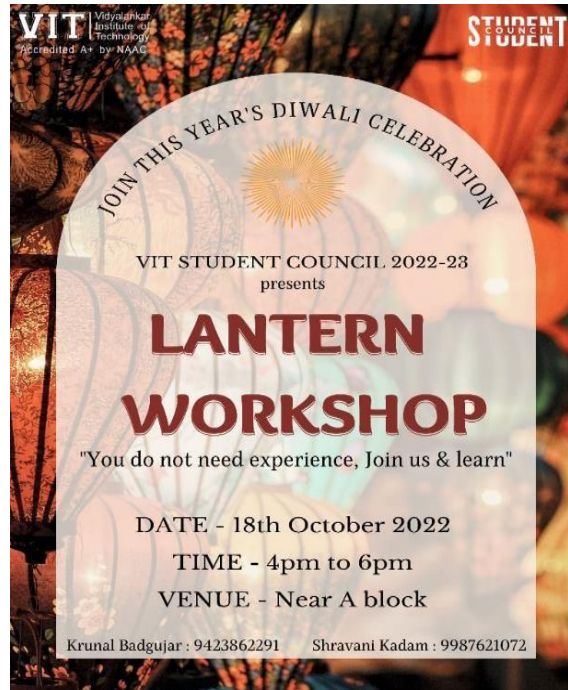

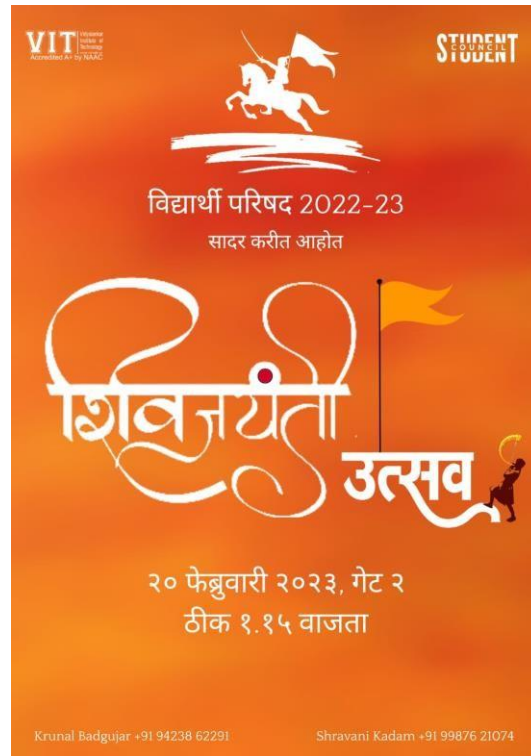

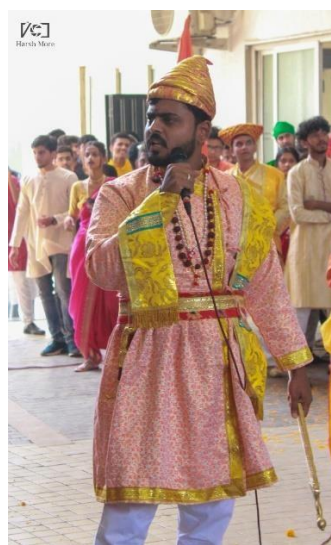
