





At 10pm all the volunteers went to sleep.




Day 3- Friday, 05/01/18

At 10pm all the volunteers went to sleep.










Benefit: The local people and the volunteers gained knowledge from this lecture and created great awareness about dengue-its symptoms and precautions.

9.30pm-10pm: Meeting was conducted with team leaders.


At **10pm** all the volunteers went to sleep.


11:30am – 12.30pm: The volunteers then had a conversation with the school children and thanked them for showing great interest in their cause for the welfare of the whole village.

Benefit: This helped the volunteers to boost up their confidence as they had to soon perform in front of villagers. This also helped them make the necessary changes and uplift the quality of their play.






5:30pm - 6pm: Tea Break.

The activity was conducted smoothly and helped in proper conduction of the annual festival VERVE 2018 for Vidyalankar Institute of Technology.


