## **NSDL WORKSHOP: SECURITIES AND CAPITAL MARKET AND THE ROLE OF DEPOSITORY AND STOCK EXCHANGE**

National Securities Depository Limited is an Indian central securities depository based in Mumbai. It was established in August 1996 as the first electronic securities depository in India with national coverage. This workshop was conducted by Mr. Marlon Correia and Ms. Harshada Lad. Mr. Correia is the Assistant Manager in NSDL, one of the largest Depositories in the world. He holds MBA degree in Marketing from Somaiya Institute of Management. He has a total industry experience of 12+ years and is a specialist in Corporate Communication and is currently working on multiple Projects in Investor Education Department of NSDL. Ms. Harshada Lad is an Assistant Manager in National Stock Exchange (NSE). She holds a Masters Degree in Finance from University of Mumbai and is currently working in the Inspection Department of NSE. She holds 6+ years of Industry experience.

This workshop was conducted by NSDL (National Securities Depositories Limited) to give students insights about "Securities and Capital Market and the role of Depository and Stock Exchange" to the students of Finance specialisation. Two sessions of 45 minutes each were taken by the 2 speakers. The workshop was structured to be a comprehensive session for the students to have a better understanding of the fundamentals and practical applicability of various aspects of Securities and Capital Markets— Role of Depositories and Stock Exchanges in India.

### **Workshop: Session 1—NSDL**

The topics covered in this session were Introduction to Securities Market, Regulatory for Securities, Primary and Secondary Market, Institutions and Intermediaries in Securities Market, Myths about Capital Market, Basics of Investing, Starting Investment in Capital Market, About NSDL and Progress of NSDL, NSDL Depository System, Services offered by Depository Participants, Features of Demat Account, Basic Services of Demat Account, NSDL Consolidated Account Statement, NSDL Investor Centric e-Services, Grievance Redressal Cell.

## GUEST LECTURE ON TECHNICAL ANALYSIS


